




William the **Conqueror built** it in the 11th century. It was a fortress, a castle and even the King's Zoo. Now it is the museum.




This monument was built to commemorate the great admiral who died at the battle of **Trafalgar** in 1805.




It is the Queen's official London residence. Every day at eleven o'clock in the morning you can see the ceremony of changing the Guard there.




It is one of the largest parks where londoners can relax. It is also famous for its Speaker's **Corner** where people can speak on any subject they want.




The famous English architect Sir Christopher Wren built it in the 17th century after the Great Fire. It took him 35 years.




You can hear the sound of it every hour in London. It got its name after Sir Benjamin Hall .




This national museum was founded in 1753. It is famous for its library and reading halls.




It is the tallest Ferris wheel in the world. It's by the river Thames in the middle of London. On the other side of the river you can see the Houses of Parliament.




It is the most famous bridge over the river Thames. There is a museum inside.




It is one of the world's biggest and most famous department stores. It was founded in 1849. Its motto is that you can buy anything there from a needle to a living elephant.



It is an art museum in Trafalgar Square which has a collection of more than 2 300 paintings. It was founded in 1824.




This theatre is associated with William Shakespear. It was built in 1599 but was destroyed by fire in 1613. The modern theatre is the exact copy of the former one.
